Transport for Norwich: Red Lion Street project update

In February 2022, we carried out a consultation on proposed changes to the Red Lion Street Traffic Regulation Orders (TROs) between Orford Place and Rampant Horse Street, to accommodate proposed new 'saw-tooth' bus bays. In response to feedback received, we have included a small section of part time loading on the eastern side.

Summary of scheme

The aims of this project are to improve facilities in the area for pedestrians and public transport users by:

- The creation of new 'saw-tooth' bus bays.
- Refurbishing the footway paving and road surfacing.
- Reconstructing the pedestrian islands and crossing point by Orford Place.

Advertisement of Traffic Regulation Orders

So that the scheme can be delivered, we need to amend some of the existing TROs in the area to bring about the following measures:

- The two bus stops outside of Debenhams will change shape to become new 34m 'sawtooth' bus bays, with the yellow lines and loading ban adjusted to accommodate them.
- Two 'saw-tooth' bus bays will be installed on the Barclays bank side, with the yellow lines and loading ban adjusted to accommodate them. Bus movements will be as they currently are and we are simply formalising a second stop in order to accommodate buses on street when needed. The bus stops location will be approximately 7m south of the current location and will be 32m in length.
- A 9m section of part time loading will be kept on the east side outside of the Yorkshire building society.
- There will be no additional bus shelters installed and the positions of the existing shelters will remain the same.

The highway work will be carried out by Norfolk County Council's Community and Environmental Services Department and their contractors.
