Guide to Admission Terms

This booklet gives information on our secondary schools in Norfolk. Schools are listed in alphabetical order. For each school you will find the address, contact details and the name of the headteacher.

Please refer to "Parent guide to admission to schools in Norfolk 2020" booklet for full information about the admissions process. The booklet can be found on the Norfolk County Council website at www/norfolk.gov.uk/admissions.

Education Health and Care Plans (EHCP)/Statements of Special Educational Needs

Where a child's EHCP/Statement of Special Educational Needs names a specific school the school must admit the child regardless of whether the school has a place available. The over subscription rules for most schools include children with EHCPs/statements as the first priority to help parents understand that children with Plans have the highest priority legally. For these schools the remaining list of rules are used to prioritise applications if the school is over subscribed.

Children in Public Care and Looked After Children

In oversubscription rules "children in public care" and "looked after children" are defined as looked after children and previously looked after children. Previously looked after children are children who were looked after and ceased to be so because they were adopted or became subject to a Residence Order or Special Guardianship Order. Some schools may give priority to children adopted from abroad but please check the individual rules for the school(s) you are applying for.

Distance

Distance will be measured on a straight line 'crow flies' basis using Ordnance Survey data. The measurement will be taken from the Post Office postcode address point on the child's home to the Post Office postcode address point on the school.

Siblings

In the oversubscription rules 'brother' or 'sister' means: brothers or sisters living at the same address including adopted children, step-brothers, step-sisters and children in foster care within a family unit. Some admission authority schools may have a different definition. See the individual school admission policy for details.

Only siblings attending school at the time of your child's proposed admission will be given a higher priority in the oversubscription rules.

Children of Staff at the School

Admission authorities may give priority in their oversubscription criteria to children of staff at the school in either or both of the following circumstances:

a) where the member of staff has been employed at the school for two or more years at the time at which the application for admission to the school is made, and/or

b) the member of staff is recruited to fill a vacant post for which there is a demonstrable skill shortage

Feeder school

Feeder school priority will only apply in the first year of entry to the school and does not apply to in year admissions.

Random Allocation

Where random allocation is used to determine the allocation of school, applicants will have their names drawn by lots to see who should be offered the place(s). There will be an independent scrutiny of the random allocation process.

Children due to transfer

Pupils transfer to secondary education from primary schools or junior schools at 11+. Secondary schools are for 11 to 16 year olds or 11-18 year olds if the school has a sixth form.

Any parent seeking a place for their child out of their chronological age group will need to apply in writing to the Local Authority. The admission authority for the school must consider the circumstances of each case. Where the application is accepted the child will be considered alongside all other applicants. Where the application is refused the parent will be offered the right of appeal unless a place can be offered in another year group.

Admissions Policy

Where applications for admission exceed the number of places available, the following criteria will be applied in the order set out below

1. A student who holds a statement of Special Education Needs and the school is named under Part 4 of the statement.
2. A student who is in the care of the local authority or provided with accommodation by that authority, being designated a looked after child
3. Siblings of students who will be registered in years 7 to 11 at the school on the first day of term when the applicant student will be joining the school
4. Children attending one of the designated feeder schools and living within the catchment area of the school
5. Children attending one of the designated feeder schools and living outside the catchment area of the school
6. Children of staff
7. Other applications

If all students within any of the above rules cannot be offered a place, the highest priority will be given to children living nearest to the school within the rule. To determine who lives nearest, distance will be measured as the crow flies.

Admissions Policy

If the number of applications exceeds availability, students will be allocated school places in the following order of priority by Norfolk Admissions:

1. Children with an EHCP (education, health and care plan) or statement of special educational needs naming the school.
2. Children who are in public care (LAC) or who have been adopted from public care (Post LAC) who are due to transfer.
3. Children with a brother or sister attending the school at the time of admission.
4. Children who are due to transfer and live in the area served by the school.
5. Children of Wensum Trust MAT staff.
6. Children who live outside the catchment, based on proximity of the child's home to Alderman Peel High School, with those living nearer being accorded the higher priority.

If all children within any of the above rules cannot be offered a place, the highest priority will be given to children living nearest to the school within that rule. To determine who lives nearest, distance will be measured on a straight-line 'crow fly' basis, using Ordnance Survey data. If following the application of admission rules

and distance two applicants cannot be separated for a final place at a school the authority will use random allocation to determine the priority for the remaining place.

Where the Academy is oversubscribed (there are more applicants than places available) places will be allocated in accordance with the following criteria and in the following order of priority.

A child who has an Education Health and Care Plan naming the school or academy is required to be admitted.

1. Looked after children (children in care), previously looked after children (previously looked after children are children who were looked after, but ceased to be so because they were adopted or became subject to a child arrangement order or special guardianship order, immediately following having been looked after) and children adopted from abroad
2. Siblings of children already at the school living in the catchment area
3. Residence within the catchment area of the school
4. Siblings of children already at the school living out of catchment
5. Children living out of the catchment area who have a faith and / or whose parents are committed Church members and wish them to receive an education in a school with a Church of England foundation. They should support this application by completing the Supplementary Information Form (SIF). Within this criterion the following hierarchy will be applied: I. Anglican II. Other Christian denomination III. Other organised religions
6. Children of staff where: I. a member of staff has been employed at the school for two or more years at the time at which the application for admission to the school is made and/or II. the member of staff is recruited to fill a vacant post where there is a demonstrable skill shortage

7. Children who are due to transfer and live outside the area served by the school who attend a school within St Benet's MAT at the opening date of the admissions round.
8. Resident out of the catchment area of the school

In the event of the having to use a tie-breaker to distinguish between two or more applications of equal strength, the child living the shortest distance from home to school in a straight line as the crow flies route should have priority

If the educational establishment is oversubscribed, after admission of pupils with a statement of special educational needs where the educational establishment is named in the statements, priority for admission will be given to those children who meet the criteria set out below, in order:

1. Children with statement of educational needs where the educational establishment is named
2. Children in public care or who have been adopted who are due to transfer
3. Children with social and medical needs who are due to transfer
4. Children who are due to transfer and have a sibling attending the educational establishment
5. Children who are due to transfer and live in the area served by the educational establishment
6. Children who are due to transfer and live outside the area served by the educational establishment and attends a feeder school
7. Service Children with appropriate documentation in place who are due to transfer
8. Overseas Children with appropriate documentation in place who are due to transfer
9. Children who are due to transfer and are children of staff who have been employed for two or more years or into a position which there is a

demonstrable skill shortage

10. Children who are due to transfer and live outside the area served by the educational establishment

If all children within any of the above rules cannot be offered a place, the highest priority will be given to children living nearest to the educational establishment within that rule. To determine student distance to the educational establishment, this will be measured on a straight line crow fly basis, using ordinance survey data.

Admissions Policy

To ensure that decisions to admit students are based on fair and transparent criteria. If the number of applications exceeds availability, students will be allocated places in the following order of priority:

1. Children with a statement of special educational needs naming the School.
2. Children who are in public care
3. Children with a brother or sister attending the school at the time of admission.

Our definition of siblings - brother or sister means: brothers or sisters living at the same address including adopted children, step-brothers, step-sisters and children in foster care within a family unit.

4. Children who are due to transfer and live in the area served by the School. The area served by the School is defined as the villages that make up the catchment areas of the following feeder schools and therefore The Aylsham Cluster of Schools:
Aldborough Primary
Bure Valley Junior
Buxton Primary
Colby Primary
Erpingham VC Primary
Hevingham and Marsham Primary Partnership

5. Children who attend an Aylsham Cluster feeder school but live outside the catchment.

6. Children who live outside the catchment, based on proximity of the child's home to the school, with those living nearer being accorded the higher priority.

If all children within any of the above rules cannot be offered a place, the highest priority will be given to children living nearest to the School within that rule. To determine who lives nearest, distance will be measured on a straight-line crow fly basis, using Ordnance Survey data. The address will be measured from the Post Office address point on the property. In the unlikely event that distance does not separate the final two or more pupils seeking the last remaining place, a random allocation will be used to determine who is offered the final place.

Admissions Policy

If the academy receives more applications than there are available places then children with the academy named on an education, health care plan (EHCP) or equivalent will be automatically admitted to the academy. If there are still places available, priority for admission will be given to those children who meet the oversubscription criteria set out below:

1. Children in public care (Looked After Children) who are due to transfer;
2. Children who are due to transfer and live in the catchment area;
3. Children who are due to transfer who have been allocated a permanent place at a Specialist Resource Base attached to the school (Places allocated by Norfolk County Council's Placement Panel);
4. Children who are due to transfer and live outside the catchment area, who have an older sibling attending the school at the time of admission (but not the sixth form);

5. Children who are due to transfer who live outside the catchment area and attend a feeder school at the opening date of the admission round;

6. Children of staff at the school:

- a) where the member of staff has been employed at the school for two or more years at the time at which the application for admission to the school is made, and/or
- b) the member of staff is recruited to fill a vacant post for which there is a demonstrable skill shortage

7. Children who are due to transfer and live outside the catchment area.

If all children within any of the above rules cannot be offered a place, the highest priority will be given to children living nearest to the school within that rule. To determine who lives nearest, distance will be measured on a straight line 'crow fly' basis, using Ordnance Survey data. If following the application of admission rules and distance two applicants cannot be separated for a final place at a school the authority will use random allocation to determine the priority for the remaining place

Admissions Policy

In the event of over-subscription, where there are more applications than there are places available, the following priorities will be used, in order, to allocate places:

1. Looked after children, or a child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption order, residence, or special guardianship order. A looked after child is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions
2. A fair banding system will be adopted for the remaining places. Each applicant will be required to take an online non-verbal reasoning test which would place them in a rank order. The applicants will then be placed in one of 5 ability bands based on their performance in the test. As far as are possible, each band will contain the same number of applicants so that each represents 20% of the applicants. The remaining places will be allocated so that an equivalent number of applicants are admitted from each band. Applicants will then be admitted according to the criteria listed below.
3. Siblings of pupils in attendance at the Academy in Year 7 to Year 11. These include brothers and sisters, half brothers and sisters and step brothers and sisters who share the same home. These also include adopted and foster brothers and sisters who share the same home.
4. Children for whom Caister Academy is the **only** school that is appropriate for the child to attend because of the child's medical needs, or because of a serious and ongoing medical condition of one or both of their parents which would prevent the parents being able to make arrangements to take their child to and from any other school, will be allocated places under this priority. Applications under this priority must be accompanied by a supplementary information form (i.e. Priority 2 Form),

Part A of which must be completed by the parents before being provided to the child or parent's G.P. or hospital consultant who must then complete Part B, sign, stamp and date the form.

The GP or hospital consultant must expressly confirm not only the nature of the medical condition of the child or parent, but also the reason why it is appropriate for the child to attend the academy, why no other school is suitable, and the medical reasons why this is the case.

The completed, signed and stamped Priority 2 Form must be provided with the common application form. An application under this priority will not be considered in cases where the completed, signed and stamped Priority 2 Form is received after the common application form has been submitted.

A decision on whether to admit a child under this priority will be made by the Admissions Panel of Caister Academy, who will take care to apply a consistent approach to all such applications received.

Where the application is successful under this priority, places under this priority will be allocated according to proximity of the child's main home address to the academy, with those living closest to the academy receiving higher priority.

Where an application is not successful under this priority, the application will be placed into the next highest priority into which it falls below and will be considered along with all of the other applications falling within that priority.

5. Pupils in the transfer age group at Caister Junior, North Denes, Great Yarmouth, Filby, Ormesby Junior, Hemsby, Winterton, St Nicholas Priory CE VA, St Georges, and Edward Worlledge Primary Schools.
6. Pupils living within the catchment area of Caister upon Sea, Filby, Ormesby, Winterton, Hemsby, Fleggburgh, Great Yarmouth and Southtown.
7. Pupils living outside of the catchment area.

If priorities have to be decided within any of these categories, children will be placed in order of priority using distance from their home to the main entrance of the academy as measured by straight line. Any reasons put forward by parents in support of their preference will also be considered. These reasons should be supported with evidence wherever possible. If the reasons concern the child's health or social wellbeing, the evidence should be provided by a medical practitioner or other social care professional. If it is considered that the reasons are sufficiently strong, the child will be placed on the school list above those whose position is based upon the distance criterion.

If the educational establishment is oversubscribed, after admission of pupils with a statement of special educational needs where the educational establishment is named in the statements, priority for admission will be given to those children who meet the criteria set out below, in order after Children with statement of educational needs where the educational establishment is named

1. Looked after Children and previously looked after children 'Looked after children and children who were looked after, but ceased to be so because they were

adopted or became the subject of a child arrangements order or special guardianship order' A previously looked after child is a child who was looked after by a local authority but ceased to be so because they were adopted, or became the subject of a child arrangements order or special guardianship order.

2. exceptional medical or social needs Children who have exceptional medical or psychological conditions that make it essential that they attend City Academy Norwich rather than any other school.
3. Children of staff Children of CAN staff at the school where the member of staff is the legal parent / guardian of that child and:
 1. Children of staff* who have, (i) been employed at the school for two or more years at the time at which the application for admission to the school is made, or (ii) have been recruited to fill a vacant post for which there is a demonstrable skill shortage.
4. Sibling living within catchment Children whose permanent home address is inside the schools' designated area (see attached map) and who have a sibling on roll at the time of application and who is expected to be attending the school when the child will enter the school.
5. Children living with catchment and attending a linked school.
6. Children living in catchment Children who live closest to the school, based on a straight line from the main front door to the entrance of the property.
7. Children living outside the catchment area
 - I. Children living outside the designated catchment area that have a sibling (including children living in the same family unit) already on the school roll and who will still be on roll as the time of the admission;
 - II. Children living outside the designated catchment area who attend a linked school as mentioned above
 - III. Children who live closest to the school based on a straight line from the main front door to the entrance of the property.

If all children within any of the above rules cannot be offered a place, the highest priority will be given to children living nearest to the educational establishment within that rule. To determine student distance to the educational establishment, this will be measured on a straight line crow fly basis, using ordinance survey data

If the academy receives more applications than there are available places then children with the academy named on an education, health care plan (EHC) or equivalent will be automatically admitted to the academy. If there are still places

available, priority for admission will be given to those children who meet the oversubscription criteria set out below:

1. Looked after children and those who were previously looked after but immediately after being looked after was adopted or became subject to a child arrangements order or special guardianship order. A looked after child is a child who is in the care of a local authority, or being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (definition used is in Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989).
2. Children who are due to transfer and have an older brother or sister already at the school at the time of admission including sixth form. Siblings are brothers or sisters living at the same address including adopted children, step-brothers, step-sisters and children in foster care within a family unit;
3. Children who have been offered a place under the music potential, aptitude and ability criteria.
4. Children who are due to transfer living nearest to the academy will be measured on a straight line crow flies basis using Ordnance Survey data;

If following the application of admission rules and distance, two applicants cannot be separated for a final place, the academy will be determined by the local authority who manages our admissions using random allocation to determine the priority for the remaining place.

Oversubscription criteria

If the academy receives more applications than there are available places then children with the academy named on an education, health care plan (EHC) or equivalent will be automatically admitted to the academy. If there are still places available, priority for admission will be given to those children who meet the oversubscription criteria set out below:

1. Looked after children and those who were previously looked after but immediately after being looked after was adopted or became subject to a child arrangements order or special guardianship order. A looked after child is a child who is in the care of a local authority, or being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions (definition used is in Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989).

2. Children in the relevant age group which normally transfers from primary to secondary school and is living within the catchment area served by the academy, first priority being given to siblings at the time of application. If applications exceed the numbers in any one of these categories, then the highest priority will be given to children living nearest the academy, as defined in 2.1 above.

Oversubscription Criteria for **Y7 Day** and other Main School Day Places

1. **FIRST PRIORITY** is given to candidates who are looked after by a Local Authority in England and Wales in accordance with section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989(b) at the time the application is made and those who were looked after but ceased to be so because they were adopted or became subject to a residence order or special guardianship order
2. **SECOND PRIORITY** is given to candidates who have a sibling who is on roll at the College or Wymondham College Prep School and who will still be a student at the College or Wymondham College Prep School at the time when the candidate, if successful, takes up his/her place. If the sibling is in Year 11 at the time of the candidate's application and has been given a conditional offer of a place in the sixth form, this does not confer a sibling priority on the candidate as there is no guarantee that the sibling will meet the terms of their offer or take up their place at the College in Year 12. A sibling is defined as a brother or sister sharing at least one parent and who is normally resident at the same address. This includes adopted children and those living in the same home under a recognised fostering arrangement.
3. **THIRD PRIORITY** is given to students who are day students at Wymondham College Prep School.
4. **FOURTH PRIORITY** is given to candidates who demonstrate a particular aptitude in music as demonstrated in tests conducted by the College. There are up to eight places available for music.

Remaining Day places are allocated on the basis of proximity to the College. This is determined as the straight line distance between the address at which the child is resident on the closing date for applications and the main entrance of the College using Ordnance Survey data and calculated by the Local Authority School Admissions Department.

Oversubscription Criteria for Year 7, Year 9 and other Main School Boarding Places These criteria apply for Year 7 and Year 9 Boarding Places and if there is oversubscription for any boarding places that may become available in Years 8 and 10. The Governing Body does not routinely admit children into Year 11.

3. **THIRD PRIORITY** is given to candidates who have a sibling who is a student at the College and will still be on the College roll at the time when the candidate, if successful, takes up his/her place.
