

PROVISION OF NEW BUS SHELTERS

Information for Town/Parish Councils

Choosing a bus shelter

Bus shelters can be constructed from wood, brick, brick and flint, glass and metal or polycarbonate and metal, and so there is sure to be a style which is right for your community. When choosing the bus shelter the Parish/Town should consider:

- The ease of maintenance and repair
- Accessibility to the shelter
- Visibility from the shelter to the approaching bus
- Installation requirements
- Provision of seating
- Provision of lighting
- Impact of the shelter on landscape (including nearby properties)
- Resistance to weathering, graffiti
- Provision of a notice board
- How bus information can be displayed
- Consents/safety requirements

There are a number of national bus shelter manufacturers and suppliers some of whom are listed further in this document. Alternatively a local contractor/building company may be able to assist you with a bespoke solution.

Location

- A bus shelter should be provided on an existing bus route, and at an existing bus stop.
- The space needs to be large enough to accommodate the shelter and a boarding area so that passengers can get on and off the bus with ease.
- The shelter should have a level, self-draining base.
- Shelters which allow passengers to wait in the shelter and see the bus approaching are more popular than those which are set back and fully enclosed.
- The shelter must not obstruct access or affect visibility

- Shelters can only be placed on private land with the landowners permission
- Shelters on the public highway need a street furniture licence (see next section for more details)

Consents and Consultation

You may need to apply for planning permission and/or conservation area consent. Please contact your district/borough council to discuss the relevant requirements. We recommend involving the planning department and conservation officers at an early stage as they can help with choosing an appropriate style of shelter for your community.

You will need to have the proposed location assessed by your local highway office to confirm that it does not affect highway safety.

If the proposed location is on public highway, you will also need a street furniture licence. The application form is available here,

We would also recommend that you discuss your proposals with your local Police Officer as some residents can be concerned about anti-social behaviour. We also suggest that neighbours close to the proposed location are consulted on your proposals. This should be done in addition to any other consultation you may be doing as part of your planning application.

Grant funding

As part of the Parish Partnership scheme Norfolk County Council is offering funding to assist Parish/Town Councils to provide or upgrade existing bus shelters. To be eligible for funding, the project must:-

- be accessible to all bus passengers
- be on a current bus route
- take account of public safety
- have the approval of the Highway Engineer
- have planning permission (if necessary)
- have conservation area consent (if necessary)

Successful applicants can receive up to 50% grant funding dependent on availability

How to apply for grant funding
