Used to get the views of as many people as possible through asking a set of questions. The responses are shown visually in graphs and charts. Results help identify what is working well and what needs to improve. The things that need to improve are set out in the **Norfolk Area SEND Strategy** and worked on.

You may hear the following words used when people are talking about involving you:



This means working together and communicating as equals, understanding and valuing one another's unique insights and expertise to create a plan to bring about positive change.

This is when all are actively encouraged and supported to work together to improve services and have an equal opportunity to contribute and respond in the sharing of ideas and decision making.

This means considering the views, opinions and feedback of all those involved, using these to form next steps and actions to bring about improvement and positive change.

Young people have said this is important so that...

- Services know how to be open and welcoming
- CYP and families can use their voice
 - People that use services get as much out of them as they can
- Communication is improved
- People are listened to, and action is taken

When we talk about services we mean things such as schools, colleges, health services, home-toschool transport and social services.
