Can you find the ancient trees as you explore? Here's a clue that will help you decide if the tree is really old: Look at how thick it's trunk is... ancient trees have very thick sturdy trunks — see how many people it takes to hug the tree by joining hands in a circle all the way around its trunk — the more people you need, the older it probably is.

How old do you think a tree has to be before it is ancient?

Do you know what species of tree have you found?

You're a funny creature!

What kinds of creatures might you see in the wood? Why not make one out of fallen twigs, leaves and cones? If you have a camera, get someone to take a picture of you next to your creation doing an action that describes your creature. Get more people in the photo doing different poses and make it as funny as possible — it'll make you laugh when you look back at it later on!

Build a house for Eli!

Where do you think Eli might live if she lived in this woodland? Find a place you think she'd like and then look around for fallen twigs and leaves to build her a house. Try building the house like a wigwam with the larger twigs first and then covering the outside with the leaves etc. Make sure you put a door in so Eli can get in and out. You could also put things inside the house you think Eli would like or create a garden for her.
