Weavers' Way North Walsham



Route Summary A 1 Mile access tested short walk along Weavers' Way through North Walsham Town

Route description

This walk has been audited to support people accessing the countryside and to improve quality of life. The walk audit checked for potential accessibility difficulties along the route. Maps are provided showing point numbers which correspond to photos and descriptions of these areas so that you can decide if this walk is suitable for you.

The route begins at the Weavers' Way car park on Station Road in North Walsham. Head east along Weavers' Way and follow the way marking through the town centre where you will pass by the historic church of St Nicholas.. As you make your way through the town centre there are plenty of cafes and shops to stop for a break. Follow Weavers' Way along Yarmouth Road and you will reach the entrance to North Walsham Memorial park on your left and this is where the route ends. The park is a great place to visit and spend some time at the end of your route and is suitable for pushchair and wheelchair access. Alternatively, you could head back into town and make your way back to the Weavers' Way car park.

For those looking to explore more of the Weavers' Way and for a longer, rural walk with beautiful views of the Norfolk countryside you could follow the Weavers' Way signage further along Yarmouth Road and out of town along Thrilby Road. 




The route begins at the Weavers' Way car park. The surface is firm 20mm gravel with some potholes. The car park can become muddy during winter periods



There is a dropped kerb on both sides of Station Road with a 10mm step. There are cracks in the tarmac on the road ranging from 5mm to 10mm creating a slightly uneven surface



There is a 20mm step out of the car park and on to the footpath where the surface changes to paved concrete



The hedge is encroaching on to the footpath, reducing the path width to 90cm on the approach to the road crossing at Skeyton New Road

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There is a gradient of 1:6.2 at the dropped kerb at the crossing over Skeyton New Road. There are cracks 5mm across in the tarmac in the road which has created an uneven surface



The surface of the trail changes to firm 20mm gravel for 100m




There is a gradient of 1:13 on the other side of the crossing at Skeyton New Road



The trail width is reduced to 900mm for 14m



The trail narrows further to a width of 85cm due to the encroaching vegetation on both sides for 20m. There is a gradient of 1:8.5 for 10m



There is a 3cm step at the dropped kerb on either side of the crossing over Aylsham Road. Take care when crossing this road as it is quite busy and there is no pedestrian crossing There is a cross gradient of 1:7.5 as the trail crosses a cycle path. The surface is paved concrete and there is no footpath for 40m as you travel along Skeyton New Road to Aylsham Road

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The path width is reduced to 65cm for 20m. There is also a cross gradient of 1:11 where the dropped curbs at each crossing has cut into the footpath




The path has become eroded at one side which has created a cross gradient of 1:11. There are small drainage gutters creating a 10mm dip across the path at intervals for 15m



Cross over at the pedestrian crossing and follow the way marking for Weavers' Way along Market Street and through the town centre to Yarmouth Road



The path width is reduced to 50-55cm at intervals for 100m due to several window box grates and door steps cutting into the footpath



There is a sustained gradient of 1:11 for 20m along Market Street. The path width is reduced to 95cm on the corner as you reach the Market Place



The surface is very rough with tarmac eroded out and cracks 3-4cm across



There is a 3cm step on the dropped kerb on both sides as you cross over Yarmouth Road



The route ends at the entrance to North Walsham Memorial Park which is suitable for pushchair and wheelchair access. You could extend your route by following the Weavers' Way out of town, following Yarmouth Road and then Thrilby Road




Disclaimer
