I, Dr David Ormerod of Mill House, 7 Mill Lane, Swaffham, Norfolk PE37 7EU hereby apply for an order under section 53(2) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 to modify the definitive map and statement for the area by:

The Application Route is an unnamed Road between Mundford Road and Brandon Road in Cockley Cley Parish. The road is undoubtedly an ancient road and runs along the parish boundary with Gooderstone parish, and is combined with Link Road that connects with Cockley Cley Road to the north. It is a green lane with features of an old 60-foot-wide drove road. The road is not currently registered on the Definitive map and is a N.C.C.-maintained unsurfaced road and shown on the OS Explorer maps as an “other road with public access.” The route is substantially narrowed by hedgerow and bush overgrowth to the extent that equine traverse is now impaired in parts. The DMMO Application proposes that the route should be declared a Restricted Byway, consonant with its history

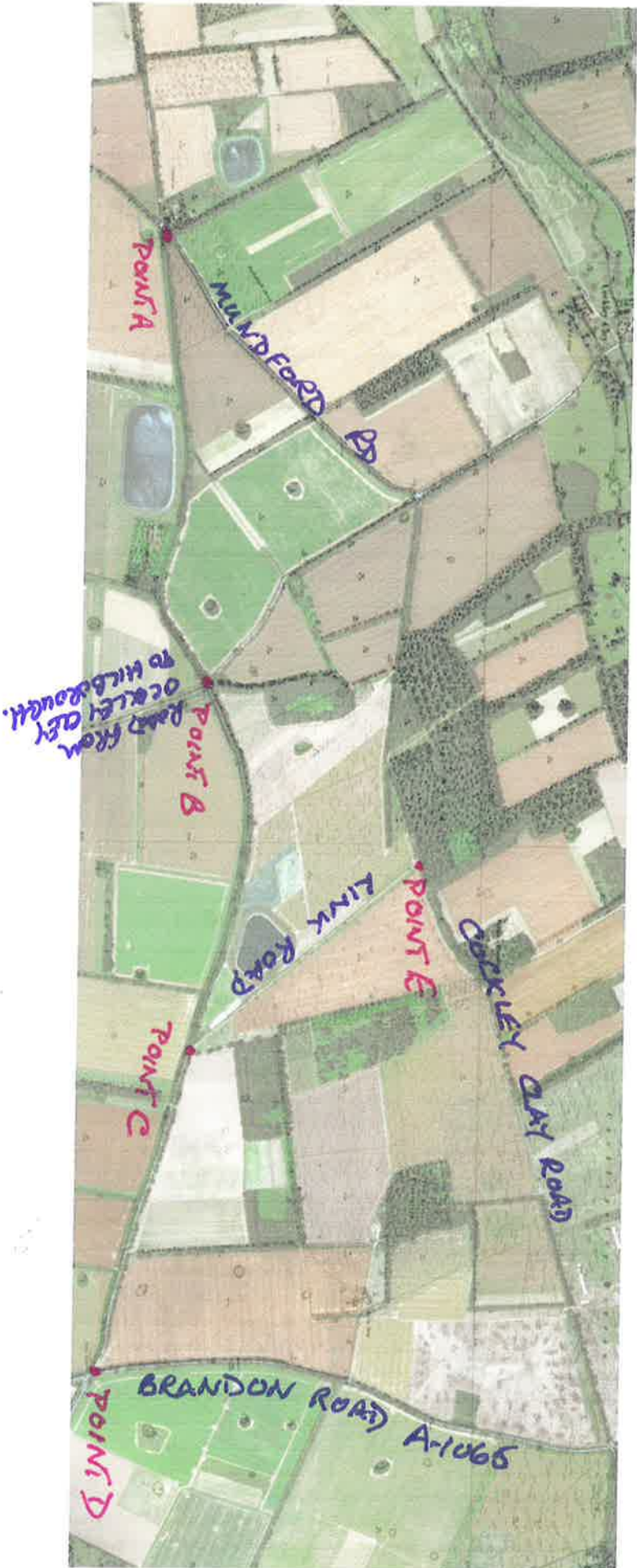


FIGURE 1. ORDINANCE SURVEY 25-INCH MAP, 1ST SERIES NORTON STREETS 71.5 AND 71.6 (INSEAD) AND OVERLAND FROM AN O.S. SANITARY MAP 1892.

THE APPLICATION ROUTES USE BRASSY (1) POINT A AND POINT D AS AN UNIMPROVED ROAD, AND (2) LINK ROAD BRASSY POINT C AND POINT E. THE ROADS ARE CURRENTLY NORTON COUNTY COUNCIL MAINTAINED UNIMPROVED ROADS, BUT ARE NO LONGER OPEN TO TRUCK ACCESS TO CARS ETC. THEY ARE OLD DRIVE ROADS AND BARELY 60-FEET WIDE, BUT NOW BARELY BARELY CONSIDERED IN PARTS.
