
The Gaywood Valley will be here a very long time; long after you so it's really important that you look after it so that your children can enjoy it, and their children after that...

- Please take some time to read any advice that is given about the area in which you are walking — check signs.
- Some of the routes pass through areas grazed by cattle, sheep or horses.
 Please take care as you walk; stay on the footpaths, leave gates as you find them and do not feed the animals.
- Take any litter (including dog litter) home or use bins provided.
- Please don't pick plants and flowers that are alive and growing (but look out for them because some of them might be in your treasure points book).

Dogs must be kept under close control on public rights of way and must not be allowed to stray from the line of the path.
