

Collect points for finding treasure... and see if you can become a Master Treasure Hunter and Protector of the Gaywood Valley!

These walks will take you to places where you will find some very special wildlife and really old buildings; these are the treasures of the Gaywood Valley. Follow the directions to make your way round the trails and see if you can find them all.

Each time you spot a treasure, tick the box next to each treasure on the list for that walk. Remember you might not always spot everything during one walk so why not go back at different times to see if you can get more points. Some plants, animals or insects only come out at certain times of the year. The information next to each species tells you when you are most likely to see these things.

Could you be a Master Treasure Hunter and Protector of the Gaywood Valley?

Here's how you earn your awards

- Collect a total of at least 500 points from all four walks (out of a total 1000 points).
- Collect a certain number of points from each walk to make up your total. At
 the bottom of each list of treasures, you will find the total number of points
 you need for that walk. Tick the box when you have reached this total
- When you've collected enough points download your certificate awarded by Eli the Elf! Go to: www.norfolk.gov.uk/Gaywoodvalley and click on the link to "Master Treasure Hunter Certificate".
