Davidson Road, Thorpe St Andrew – Pavement reconstruction / resurfacing.

Further to my previous correspondence (dated 24 November 2023)

Work will begin on or shortly after Monday 8 January 2024 to reconstruct the pavement on Davidson Road whereby the damaged surface will be removed and replaced with a new surface. The works are expected to take approximately 12 weeks to complete, subject to suitable weather conditions (expected duration has been revised up from 8 weeks stated in previous correspondence to allow for possible disruption due to poor weather and a slightly different scope to the works, resulting in more need for hand digging than was originally proposed).

The works will be carried out in phases to help minimise disruption. To ensure that the works are carried out safely, it will be necessary for Davidson Road to be closed for the entire duration to through traffic. In addition to this there will be closures at the junctions of Davidson Road/Birkbeck Way and Davidson Road/Thomas Vere Road to prevent through traffic onto Davidson Road throughout the duration of the works.

While the work is underway vehicular access to properties will be maintained via Thomas Vere Road. There may be some temporary restrictions to vehicular access to individual properties as work takes place in front of driveways.

The site compound will be located at the junction of Davidson Road/Birkbeck Way to facilitate the works.

The County Council thanks people for their patience while this pavement surface improvement work is carried out.

The work which will cost approximately £91,300 will be carried out by Norfolk County Council's Community and Environmental Services Department and their contractors.
