I, Dr David Ormerod of Mill House, 7 Mill Lane, Swaffham, Norfolk PE37 7EU hereby apply for an order under section 53(2) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 to modify the definitive map and statement for the County of Norfolk by registering the passage of the ancient Icknield way across Swaffham Heath as a Restricted Byway. The route is predominantly registered as bridleway, comprising Swaffham BR3, Beachamwell BR4, a small part of Beachamwell BR18, and Cockley Cley BR1. However, there is a relatively large segment in the south that is unregistered ancient highway, between TF 78040629 and TF78600523(Point K), where the application route runs directly into Cockley Cley BR1, ending on Pine Avenue, Cockley Cley. Substantial historical data is presented. Much of the transit covers Forestry Commission Land, mostly freehold, but with small privately-owned sections centrally and a leasehold segment at its southern end.


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
