What we use your personal information for

We use your personal information primarily to manage the NAFCB including:

- Minuting NAFCB meetings for publication;
- Minuting other associated groups;
- Providing attendees with an aid to memory or reasonable adjustment to support their attendance and participation; and
- Advising NAFCB members of meetings and events.

We may also use information in other ways compatible with the above.

The information we collect and use

The information we may collect and use may include your:

- Name
- Work address
- Home address if no work address is available
- Work email address
- Personal email address if no work address is available
- Work telephone numbers including mobile phone numbers
- Personal telephone numbers including mobile phone numbers if no work numbers are available
- Comments, views and opinions expressed by you in these meetings
- Health information in relation to reasonable adjustments if required

Who provides this information

The information we hold includes information you have provided to us.

How the law protects you and the legal basis for processing your information

We have legal grounds to process this information because it is necessary to comply with a legal duty or fulfil a public task. This includes the provision of a Covenant Board (also known as a Military/Civilian Partnership Board under the Armed Forces Act 2011).

Your health data in relation to reasonable adjustments is collected for reasons in the substantial public interest and to meet our public task set out in the paragraph above.

Who we share your information with

We may share your personal information with:

- other departments in NCC (for example: the communications team for press releases; the Chairman's Office for invitations to civic events and commemorations; and other NCC officers for specialist advice);
- partner organisations who wish to invite you to attend events relevant to your position on the NAFCB; and
- other organisations and public bodies, in particular, where agreed minutes of the NAFCB are requested by interested parties.

Automated decision making

We do not make automated decisions about you.

How we keep your information

We hold your personal information in accordance with our retention and erasure policy. The information is stored electronically, on the NCC's records management system. Additionally, information is securely stored in other mediums, including email accounts and in paper files.

We do not process your information outside of the European Economic Area.
