I, Dr David Ormerod of Mill House, 7 Mill Lane, Swaffham, Norfolk PE37 7EU hereby apply for an order under section 53(2) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 to modify the definitive map and statement for the area by registering the Little Massingham BR2 as a Restricted Byway.

This public highway across the old Grimston Heath and Common is part of an old trans-country highway passing between villages in an east-to-west direction in north west Norfolk. The purpose of this definitive map modification order is to upgrade the transit of Little Massingham BR2 to a restricted byway, consonant with other parts of this route that provides an important connection with Peddars Way at Little Massingham and affords one of the more important laterals to that ancient regional public vehicular highway.


